

## CLINICAL PAIN MANAGEMENT FELLOWSHIP AWARD, 2011

The Canadian Pain Society in partnership with Pfizer Canada provides the Clinical Pain Management Fellowship Award. This award will support graduates of Canadian postgraduate medical education programs who wish to complete a further year of study in pain management at a Canadian University offering a fellowship program in pain management. Applications will also be considered from individuals who wish to complete further study at institutions outside of Canada; however such requests should clearly justify the selection of a training site outside of Canada.

Applicants must have completed an MD, have completed (or will complete before commencement of the fellowship) a residency program accredited by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada or the College of Family Physicians of Canada and are a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant with permanent Canadian residence.

This award provides economy travel to the annual Canadian Pain Society Conference, one night's hotel accommodation at the conference hotel rate, complimentary conference registration for one day and a complimentary dinner ticket. The recipient will book their own travel arrangements and provide receipts after the conference for reimbursement, provide the arrival and departure date for the hotel booking with the CPS office and will pick up their dinner ticket at the conference. The recipient will be announced at the dinner/awards evening at the 2011 conference.

The value of the award is \$90,000.

Applicants must submit a cover letter, CV, and 2 letters of reference one of which must be from the Director of their residency program. If the applicant has already completed specialty training then a copy of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada or College of Family Physicians of Canada certificate should be submitted along with 2 letters of reference. A letter of support from the Director of the program the candidate proposes for their fellowship year of study is also required. There is an expectation that the fellowship should include clinical experience in acute, chronic and palliative care along with research exposure. The successful candidate will be expected to present a report to the review committee upon completion of the Fellowship Year. The applicant does not have to be a CPS member.
