## The Case of Tramadol

Pain of all types continues to be under-treated in Canada. Unfortunately, some of our most effective pain relieving medications can also become drugs of abuse with the potential for significant harm to the individual and society. By scheduling a drug under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act, governments try to balance making valuable medications available while increasing the requirements for documentation and monitoring. Unfortunately this also creates a significant psychological barrier to prescribing.

Health Canada has published their intention to schedule all forms of tramadol in Canada. Is this justified based on the current evidence?

Join us as we hear from experts in the field of pharmacology, addiction, pharmacovigilance, pain management, law enforcement, regulators and patients on the evidence and arguments for and against this action.
